Course Description:

This is a five-day course, with lectures and working group sessions. All sessions presented will be in English.

The topics to be covered in the course are:

- General Principles of Toxicology
- Risk Assessment of chemicals I: problem formulation, hazard versus risk, dose-response
- Risk Assessment of chemicals II: exposure assessment and risk characterization
- The role of pathology in risk assessment
- Zebra fish as a model for toxicological studies
- WHO international program on chemical safety
- Guidelines for testing of chemicals (OECD)
- Safety evaluation of chemicals and drugs regarding their **liver toxicity**
- Safety evaluation of chemicals and drugs regarding their **kidney toxicity**

- Risk assessment and the **lungs**
- Immunotoxicology
- Risk assessment of chemicals affecting reproductive system
- Endocrine disrupting chemicals safety assessment
- Biosafety of pesticides
- Toxicology in the 21st century – Tox 21; 3R and New Approach Methodologies (NAMs)
- Genotoxicity, mutagenicity, clastogenicity – evaluation
- Skin sensitization using 3R methodologies, quantitative risk assessment and safety assessment of fragrance materials
- Biosafety of food and food ingredients
- Risk Assessment of Carcinogens
- Biosafety of vaccines
- Risk perception and risk communication
- Managing human health risks

Fees:

The attendance fee for all participants are as follows:

Students (in person):	\$100USD
Students (online):	\$150USD
Other Participants (in person):	\$250USD
Other Participants (online):	\$300USD

All in-person fees cover registration and meals (coffee breaks, lunches, plus a private group tour in São Paulo). Participants are responsible for their own transportation and lodging.

Online registration includes the lectures only (no working group or case study sessions).

Selection Criteria for Participation:

1. Work and experience in toxicology related areas
2. Reference letters from employer or university professor
3. Geographic distribution and representation
4. Gender distribution
5. English proficiency
6. Ability to pay the registration fee and all transportation/lodging costs

Participants are welcome to bring their posters on toxicology and risk assessment topics.

Hotel/Lodging:

All attendees are responsible for their own lodging arrangements. A list of nearby hotels is included in these materials. Attendees are eligible to receive a modest lodging subsidy, upon request.
